When support ends in 2019, software or security updates and break/fix support will no longer be available from the manufacturer. This purchase is to upgrade/replace approximately one-half of the EOL switches with the second half being upgraded/replaced in FY 18/19.

Inter-Agency Charges:

- (1) Office of Administration Information Technology Office(OA-OIT) Billing of \$122,859.12 for the PLCB's service request (#3134) to relocate our disaster recovery servers from the current Cameron Street location to the Commonwealth Technology Center's "Co-Location" site.
- **(2) Department of Auditor General** FY 2017-18 first quarter billing of \$868,559.94 from the Department of the Auditor General. The billing includes \$115,957.52 for the "true-up" for the estimated billing for FY 2016-17 fourth quarter services. The remaining \$752,602.42 balance of the bill is for the first quarter services (actual expenses), which is \$56,709.15 (-7.0%) less than the FY 2016-17 first quarter billing.

The Bureau of Financial Management and Analysis has reviewed these charges and determined that they are reasonable based on billing methodology and previous experience.

Board Member Negra asked Nick Melnick, Chief Information Officer, to provide some background on the relocation of the PLCB's disaster recovery servers from the current site and the related expenses.

Mr. Melnick indicated that the existing site for the disaster recovery servers is located on Cameron Street in Harrisburg, and the PLCB is not being charged for that location. However, that site is being closed, and the disaster recovery servers are being moved to a new location for which there will be associated expenses.

Board Member Negra asked if these will be one-time expenses, or whether they will be recurring expenses.

Mr. Melnick indicated that the expenses will be recurring.

Board Member Negra then questioned whether there are any issues with the existing site on Cameron Street that necessitate a move to a new location.

Mr. Melnick indicated that the existing site is older and is located within a flood plain, which is not a good place for the servers to be housed. He expressed his opinion that the move is necessary.
